Local Council Elections 4th May 2023



Are you interested in becoming a Parish Councillor? Parish Council elections are held every 4 years, when the whole Parish Council stands down and local people have the opportunity to put themselves up for election as a Parish Councillor. We think it is very important and democratic to encourage people in the local community to stand for election.

It is an interesting position to hold in the Parish, where you handle the spending of the Precept (local tax), on the maintenance of The Grange and Pavilion, or additional spending on highways, cleansing, local needs of the community and having an input into planning applications.

The election will take place on Thursday 4th May. More information will be available from South Derbyshire District Council in due course, when they will ask for nominations. Notices will be placed in the Parish. The project wouldn’t assume that people could already do these activities but would recognise that while some people would be confident with, say, needlework, we could organise workshops for the community to help people sew, draw on cloth, paint etc. There might also be another thread running through all of these around research into local and county archives to pick out village names, or records of incidents: houses, streets, field names and features that might now be lost.

The aim of the project is the celebration of our village and to bring together local knowledge in a fun and enjoyable way.

Defibrillator use:

- a) telephone 999 immediately.
- b) The operator will take details and send an ambulance.
- c) If on hearing the patient's symptoms, the operator decides that the defibrillator is required, he will tell you its location (back wall of the village hall), and the code number to open the box.
- d) Remove both the defibrillator and the accompanying package from the box and take it to the patient.
- e) Open the defibrillator and you will be given full spoken instructions from the defibrillator on how to use it
